The April Maple



The Tale of the Prayer Shawl Ministry

As my friend Chris Bonno was browsing a UMW Book Table in 2007, she picked up and then bought the book, "Knitting into the Mystery" by Susan Jorgenson and Susan Izard (2003). This book was about Prayer Shawl ministry and Chris, shared it with me and said, "Do you think we could do this at our church?"

After some consideration, prayer, and persistence, a Prayer Shawl Class started at MUMC. Some folks learned how to knit or crochet and others learned that they are *not interested in knitting or crocheting!* We learned that since each stitch is prayerfully made, a completed prayer shawl represents thousands of prayers! Over the past 13 years, our group has presented more than 250 shawls to those who are sick, grieving, or in need of encouragement *as well as* those who are celebrating a wedding or baptism or those who are beginning their freshman year of college.

I treasure moments when I have wrapped a shawl around a mourning widow and prayed with her, when I have *received* a prayer shawl from a traveling companion who has since passed away, when photos of students wearing shawls were texted to me and when we laugh and converse together at our Prayer Shawl gathering on Thursday nights.

There are several ways that you can join us!

1. When the public health emergency is over, you can join our group on Thursday evenings from 7pm-8:30pm in the Lounge.
2. You can knit or crochet a shawl at home and we will pray over it and give it away to someone in need.
3. You can donate money for yarn purchase since some of our stitchers spend considerable out-of-pocket funds to keep our shawl supply adequate.

If you know of someone who would like a Prayer Shawl, please contact Pastor Wendy, Linda Herbster, or myself. Like the Good Samaritan, who showed compassion, the Prayer Shawl group hopes that our stitching helps people to encounter God's love in a tangible way. Our work and care link us to God's grace. Praise the Lord.

faith and finances

On March 15 our worship services were cancelled, and we held a Prayer Service to discuss how MUMC will continue to be the church for each other and our community. We dared to dream and set forth goals for how we would move forward into the unknown. The following Sunday we held our first live streamed worship serviced with more than 200 people interacting! What a blessing!!

We also committed to calling each other and caring for each other as best we can in this time of scattered isolation. AND, we committed to continue to feed the hungry and those in need. In the following couple of weeks, we gave out over 200 HOT takeout meals, kept our food closet open, and passed out grocery bags to 40 families in partnership with the Interfaith Food Alliance.

Our building is shut down, and our ministry and mission looks completely different – but God is still God and we are still called to BE THE CHURCH TO THE WORLD. And so we shall!

This means expenses continue.

There are ways for everyone to be generous during this time frame.

The easiest method is to mail your offerings to the church so they can be deposited on a weekly basis.

A second method is through your online banking portal where you can set up a disbursement through the Bill Pay section. The bank will then mail a check from your account to the church in the amount you direct. You can direct this as frequently as you wish, and it should be free (Saves Postage).

The third method is by accessing the online giving portal through the church's webpage, www.mumcpa.org. At the bottom of the home page is a link to give through the online giving site. You can designate your giving either by credit card or through your bank account and make it re-occurring. This will go to the General Fund.

On my birthday, Saturday Feb 22, I attended the pancake breakfast at church; that evening I went back to church to attend Holy Grounds Café – our first coffee house. Smiled that God should be proud of me starting and ending my birthday in His house! Later that night as I got ready for bed, I noticed a huge rash down the front of my legs to my toes and on my hands – hundreds of tiny purple pin head size spots – not raised, no itch! So, what does one do? Google of course! I spent 30 minutes and couldn't find a similar picture but noticed during that time the rash had spread more on my hands. No other symptoms – felt fine! I assumed a fast-moving allergic reaction that might get worse while I slept – maybe my throat would close up and I'd be dead in the morning! I called my daughter to take me to the ER!

Bloodwork results showed I had ITP – extremely low blood platelet count (normal count level 150,000-400,000, and I only had 2,000! Platelets coagulate your blood and mine were so low, if I had a hard fall I could have bled to death! Wow! Needed immediate IV steroids and immune globulin to kick start raising levels; immune system sometimes just acts up and destroys platelets! A man wheeled me up to my room and I shared with a laugh how I had bragged to God about starting and ending my birthday in church and now looks like God didn't like my bragging so was “punishing” me! As we approached my room, the man said something like this....” No, God is sending you on a birthday getaway! Here's your big private room, great meals included, maid service, people to wait on your every need, and you can even get a massage! Relax and enjoy it. It's your birthday gift from God!”

As I thought about it, I cried a little. Yes, bad me had bragged to Him, but I know He loves me and He knew exactly where I needed to be later that night. It took that man – my Birthday Angel – to remind me and he helped change my attitude to gratitude and thanksgiving!

You might remember that through your Faith Promise Mission Giving in January, \$3,200 was given to partners in our community and around the world who love God's children in practical and meaningful ways. We continued this important work in February:

- \$1,000 was given to Family Services of Bucks County to offer support to the homeless population in our community through counseling, housing and food. They also come alongside people fighting against personal addictions and those coming out of prison.
- We held our first of many Holy Grounds Coffee Cafe experiences in our Hall on February 22. Over 60 guests enjoyed the music, worship and fellowship of the evening. What a blessing!

We are planning our next Coffee House for April 25th but understand that it will most likely be postponed.

- \$500 was given to Livingrin, an organization that helps people in recovery.
- We have an on-going ministry with the children of the Morrisville Schools. Until our schools were closed for health and safety reasons, we supplied a weekly meal, a weekday after school program, and use of our space for weekly programs for Jr and Sr High students. We look forward to beginning again as soon as we are able. In the meantime, we are staying connected with our After School Adventure children with weekly "gift bags" filled with Bible story activities and fresh snacks.

Believe in their dream TO STEP OUT OF POVERTY


